AGM 2022 President's Report

The poet Robert Burns wrote in 1786, that "The best-laid plans of mice and men often go awry" and "leave us naught but grief and pain for promised joy." Best-laid plans going astray; trading joy for grief and pain? Sounds like the last two years!

Groups are now slowly returning to dancing but inevitably some groups have been forced to close for a variety of reasons. Age and Covid have been a major factor. Groups have had to deal with constantly changing restrictions, procedures and protocols set out by the government and the venue hirers. SARDA NSW was fortunate in securing a NSW government stimulus package to assist groups financially. In 2021 a \$150 and in 2022 a \$200 grant has been made available to group leaders on their return to dancing each year.

During 2020-2021 social connections became even more important in square & round dancing as many people felt isolated during lockdowns. As a result SARDA NSW purchased an annual subscription to the Zoom platform. This was made available to any club who wanted to utilise the platform to keep in touch with their fellow dancers.

Promotions became more important but when to start during this roller coaster period! New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia had collaborated together in organising a community radio promotion for square dancing utilising the radio ads that the National Society has developed. I was interviewed by Kevin Walsh from Good Morning Country and Sasha Boon, from Victoria, also did an interview with Julie from Saturday Breakfast which was aired on community radio stations. Whilst the timing was not ideal, it is still important to spread the word that square dancing is alive and a wonderful activity.

The 41st NSW State Convention at Gloucester was cancelled as a result of the uncertainty that the pandemic had caused. Jim Brooks and Rhonda Smith, who were the convenors of the convention, were very inventive and decided to organise some fantastic activities for anyone who was still intending to travel to Gloucester. With some assistance from locals, Maree and Graeme Marsh and Gerald and Sandra Ring they presented a wonderful weekend.

Planning is going ahead for the 42nd NSW State Convention in the Blue Mountains utilising some of the resources from the cancelled 2020 National Convention. Blue Mountains Grammar School is the venue on the long weekend in October 2022.

There will be a separate report from this convention

Sadly we noted the passing of Barbara Tonitto, Ken Fagan, Peggy Butler, Lorna Lown and recently Mary-Lou Woods.

However, on a happier note we celebrated with Kit Spalding who turned 100 in 2021. Kit is a Life Member of the Association and a Life Patron of the Australian National Convention Board. She has been a wonderful ambassador for square and round dancing over many years.

AGM 2022 President's Report

Tedda Brooks retired at the end of June. Tedda & Marion will be remembered for the many charity dances they ran for the Calvery Respite Hospital. Tedda will also be remembered for his wonderful singing voice. Best wished to Tedda & Marion in their retirement from square dancing.

Les Heaton closed his club on the Central Coast mainly due to the unpredictable nature of Covid-19 combined with dancing in a retirement village. Les' retirement was short lived as he is calling for Tartan Promenaders.

Terry Lee decided to finish up Dance Around at West Ryde. I'm sure it could not have been an easy decision for Terry to make after so many years however, due to COVID restrictions and the cost involved in running the dance with very few dancers it has been the ultimate choice.

What will our activity look like into the future? Experts believe that social connectedness in the world after the pandemic may well play a protective role for mental health and well-being. This could provide square dancing with a point of difference to encourage new dancers to give square dancing a try. After all it is the perfect activity to provide social connectedness, as well as physical and cognitive activity.

Scope

I have audited the attached financial report of The Square and Round Dance Association of NSW Inc as set out on the attached statements for the year ended 31st December 2021. The Executive Committee is responsible for the maintenance of records and for the preparation and presentation of the financial statements and the information contained therein. I have conducted an independent audit of the financial statements in order to express an opinion on them to the members.

My audit has been conducted in accordance with accepted Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance that the financial statements are presented free of material misstatement. My examination included random tests of detail entries supporting the financial statements, an overview of information handling procedures and information supplied by the Association's Treasurer. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether in all material respects the financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with professional and statutory requirements.

Fund Raising Activities

It is not practical for the Square & Round Dance Association of NSW Inc to maintain an effective system of internal control over fund raising until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly my audit in relation to fund raising was limited to amounts recorded.

During the COVID pandemic the Association, as a courtesy to members, had been sending a printed magazine to ALL members who elected option B or C. Option A members received their magazine by a variety of different methods. No charge was made for Diary entries for those groups who had paid in 2020. The magazine is available free online to members via the www.sarda.nsw website.

A Brief History of Square Dancing

Square dancing traces back to Europe during the seventeenth century. Here is a brief overview of its evolution:

Beginnings of the dance form. In John Playford's 1651 book *The English Dancing Master*, the bookseller and publisher wrote about four-couple dances in square and circle formations in England, Ireland, and Scotland. This form of dance, referred to as an English country dance, Irish set dance, or Scottish country dance, was a primary influence on square dancing, as were two eighteenth-century French dances: the cotillion and the quadrille, which both involved couples in square formation and combinations of dance steps, such as the ladies' chain, in which female dancers passed each other on the right while giving their left hand to their male partners. Many of the dance moves notated in Playford's book remain a part of North American square dance, which earned its name to differentiate it from the contra dance, a popular line dance.

Square dance reaches America. Europeans brought their dance moves to America, where the quadrille enjoyed considerable popularity after the American Revolution. In the nineteenth century, it became common practice for slave owners to force enslaved Black Americans to serve as musicians at square dances. They would eventually revolutionize the dance form by inventing "calling," or announcing the steps and formation of the dances to dancers, which helped organize the dance floor. Calling would go on to become a defining characteristic of the form, though it was met with backlash by white critics at the time.

Shaw integrates the dance into high school programs. Square evolved from a regional folk dance to an American art form largely through the efforts of educator Lloyd Shaw. He solicited dance instructions from callers across the country to integrate into a national physical education program for high schools after World War II. American square dancing received additional support from the folk revival movement in New York during the 1950s, spurring interest in many different forms of traditional entertainment.

Square dancing in contemporary society. American square dance remained popular throughout the mid-to-late twentieth century and was named the national dance in 1982. By that time, square dancing had declined in popularity and was not attracting new square dancers, so many schools eliminated it from their curriculums. Attempts were made to connect with young or gay populations in the 1970s and 1980s, but the following remained modest in size. However, square dancing remains popular at the regional level in the US, United Kingdom, Germany, Japan and Australia.

EMERGENCY CALL FOR MEDICAL AID



- 1 When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.
- 2 Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This will allow the injured person and attendant air and room.
- 3 Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.
- 4 On seeing this signal, the caller or hall monitor will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.
