NSW President Gordon Hearne 1991-1999



Early 1991 I was asked to put my name forward to be a part of the committee of the NSW Square Dance Society. Jan and myself decided to attend the AGM in March, where I was elected as Vice President. We had regular monthly meetings at various homes and venues. In September I was elected as President as Alan Hansford was stepping down from the position.

Once elected Jan and myself decided to get around the clubs and let the dances know the objectives of the Society and to encourage membership. This involved attending all Sydney clubs at least twice a year and attending club's special nights as well as dancing at our club the Wanderers each week. I was very fortunate to have a mentor in our club, Bill Rolph (Bill was a former President) whom I could ask for advice at any time.

My job required me to visit country areas. As I was travelling long distances, Jan was able to accompany me. This allowed us to drop in on many country club dances.

The Society continued to hold a dance on every 5th Saturday with selected callers. Themes and decorations were designed for all these dances, and I was very fortunate to have a great committee to carry out all these duties. We held the 40th Anniversary Dance in 1996 which was held on the Central Coast where over 500 dancers attended.

We were having trouble in getting a convenor and committee members for our yearly State Conventions, still the same today, so we paid visits to various Sydney and country clubs to talk to dancers or callers and ask them to take up the roll of convenor or become committee members. At the time State Conventions were run with no real guidelines to date so with the help of Alan Hansford, Bruce Clark and Cec Wilcox we went over all the minutes from previous State Convention AGM and formulated a Constitution for the running of State Conventions which was formally accepted in 1996 at Wellington. Alan Hansford, Bruce Clark and myself became very involved with the State Conventions whilst I was President and we were given the name of "The boys from the city".

Many meetings were held at our house dealing with updating the NSW Square Dance Society Constitution, reviewing the South Pacific Square Dance Review rules of operation and costing and the State Convention Constitution.

Nationally, in 1996 our son Andrew came up with the idea of a national square dance web page so that anybody could see what was happening and where to go in Australia square dancing. Many hours were spent setting up the rules to be able to allow the web site to work. The rules were accepted at the 1996 National Convention in Launceston. During the National Convention in Launceston the late Gary Brown, the late Adrian Brown, Andrew and myself sat together with plans suggested by Adrian and Andrew

When the Tamworth Lazy Diamonds folded in 2007, three members of that club, namely Lyn and Doug Neaylon and Max Hall, decided to continue with their Square Dancing and formed the Tamworth Cloverleaf Dancers Club. For twelve years the club met each week (except during the Christmas and January holiday break) on a Wednesday night at the Kootingal Memorial Hall. For the first few years the club was fortunate to have "real" callers but when the last one resigned, it was left to Max to take on the teaching, using the CD recorded music of Brian Hotchkies and the like. Max learnt all the square dance definitions and was confidently able to instruct the dancers, both existing and new. After the two years of Covid-forced closure, the club began again in March 2022, with a new venue, a new night, and a new "real" caller who Max introduced to the club as Malcolm Turnbull. Four new dancers have also joined the club. In June, Max resigned from the club and handed the reins to Malcolm. The club members appreciate the many years that Max devoted to the club and would like to thank him for helping them to become proficient Square Dancers and wish him well in his "retirement".

Malcolm learnt to call, many years ago, and has welcomed the opportunity to revise his learning and is doing a good job with the Tamworth Cloverleaf Dancers. Offering friendship, fun and laughter, the Club is hoping to attract new members to Square

for a Youth Council. Gary and I along with Adrian and Andrew formulated the rules to which the Youth Council would operate. These rules were accepted at the 1997 National Convention in Newcastle. The web site and the Youth Council have been further developed and are now under the control of the National Square Dance Society of Australia.

We were fortunate enough to have a dancer in our club who arranged for me to meet with the organisers of Seniors Week in Sydney. As a result, we were able to hold two promotional dances around the forecourt of the Opera House and the highlight was that in 1996 we were invited to perform at the Sydney Entertainment Centre in the Premiers Concert during Seniors Week with Mary Schneider, John Schuman, Dianna Hammond, Kamahl and Smokey Dawson. It was arranged for Tedda Brooks to call and two sets of Guys and Dolls dancers.

In early 1996 we received a phone call from a Japanese cruise line asking if we could teach passengers on the cruise ship Asuka between Brisbane and Sydney section of their world cruise. We accepted and arranged for a caller and a square of dancers to go. Then in 1999 and 2000 we received a similar request but this was for a cruise from Cairns to Sydney, we accepted and arranged for a caller and a square of dancers to go.

To move away from paper membership records and paper receipts in 1994 I designed a database for recording membership details and laminated cards as a confirmation of membership and payment. The database also included club contacts and Review lists for clubs and address labels for Review distribution.

We had two large banners made for outside promotion and the first time we used them was at a dance at Darling Harbour where we tied them to wire fencing on the edge of the dancing area near the edge of wharf. The dance was in full swing when a gust of wind came up and the banners and the fencing went into Darling Harbour water. On the following Monday we approached the Darling Harbour Management to get permission to dive and retrieve the banners, after some toing and froing we were given permission to recover them. Many thanks to Vickie Dean and her brother for the recovery.

To further promote the Society we organised for bumper stickers to be printed and distributed. From this it was thought that a phone number should be used so contact could be made to a real person to gain club information. The 1800 number was thought to be the best way to go so I arranged for a 1800 number to be connected. This was originally for NSW but has since been extended to be used nationally and maintained by the National Square Dance Society of Australia.

Jeff remembers:

Jeff began dancing at HH Squares with Sue Humphries and Ashley Shore in 1981 at the Anglican Church at Hurstville Grove.

Six months later, Jeff invited his mother to a Square Dance party, and mum invited Lorraine (1982).

Lorraine ran her own hairdressing salon at Allawah at this time.



Lorraine joined the HH club after this party and about six months later, Sue Humphries invited Jeff and Lorraine to be part of a competition square called The Cascades, not as partners, just as team members (Ed Coleman was also a member). After about 5 years, Lorraine and Jeff partnered up in a more serious way and were married on 16th April 1988.

In 1994, Lorraine and Jeff moved to the Central Coast and immediately joined Les Heaton's Peninsula Rippers.

Lorraine got involved in calling because Jeff won the club's amateur calling night. Lorraine decided she could do better, and she did, winning it the next year.

She then did a callers course with Chris Froggatt in Sutherland in 1997.

When Les closed his Peninsula Rippers, Lorraine was asked by numerous dancers to call for them. Pelican Promenaders was formed in 2008 and was run by Lorraine until 2014.

Lorraine devoted lots of time preparing and running this dance. Her voice was able to cope with a large range like a male voice. Her voice was uniquely suited to both calling and yodelling.

Always involved with sewing, Lorraine made two squares of Pelican dress sets for her club.

After moving to the Central Coast, Lorraine and Jeff began dancing with Peninsula Rippers. As very experienced dancers, they always helped new dancers through the various moves.

Lorraine joined the sewing bee with Joyce Heaton and others, preparing many outfits for conventions and other functions. Lorraine also helped with preparations and during the state convention at Terrigal, she misplaced her bag one night. She had everybody searching high and low for it. The bag was finally found where Lorraine had actually left it.

Lorraine decided to try calling, and having a very nice voice, she travelled to Sutherland each Saturday to attend Chris Froggatt's callers class. She also spent many hours with Les Heaton, learning and honing calling techniques.

Lorraine eventually started the Pelican Promenaders club at Woy Woy and enticed many new people into square dancing.

Both Lorraine and Jeff became valued members of the square dancing fraternity, local community and the local church.



Jane and John remember:

After our new house was completed, in the July school holidays of 2001, John rang Brian to enquire about the local dances. (We had not danced for 36 years). Brian mentioned Les Heaton's Peninsula Rippers on Tuesday, Brian's B-Bar-H on Wednesday and Carpenter & Co on Thursday. We duly arrived at Ettalong in slacks and jumpers for Les's dance on Tuesday, where we first met Lorraine and Jeff. By the time we were ready for Brian's dance the next day, Lorraine had outfitted us both in full square dance attire, needless to say free of charge.



At two of our favourite conventions, Canberra 2014 and Buderim 2016, we shared accommodation and driving with Lorraine and Jeff. This made those conventions memorable and extra special.

Lorraine was our hairdresser, always a shoulder to cry on, and we continued to share coleus, succulents and dancing lady orchids.

Anne and Rob remember:

We first met Lorraine Long when we started square dancing at St Lukes church in Woy Woy with the Pelican Promenaders in 2011. She was such a good caller and made us feel very welcome. We loved her singing calls and especially her yodelling calls. Lorraine and Jeff became good friends, and when she decided to retire from running the

On 27th June, the Central Coast Pelican Promenaders lost long-time member Lorraine Long. Lorraine was an active dancer, caller and organiser for many years, and we have been saddened by her passing. Lorraine is remembered as being generous, hospitable and kind. Her love of life was evident not only in her dancing but in everything she did. She was a talented hairdresser, seamstress, painter, knitter and a keen gardener. She was a generous host and loved to entertain.

Lorraine was generous in her service to others in many ways. She provided haircuts to friends in their homes or in nursing homes, and regularly visited friends who were unwell. She volunteered her time to sew square dancing costumes for the Pelican Promenaders' convention team. At the time of her passing, she had also knitted 148 beanies for merchant seamen in cold-climates.

A loving wife to Jeff, mother to Derek and friend to many, she is a great loss to the square dancing community.

June Brocklebank.

Brian (Hotchkies) and Gary (Carpenter) remember Lorraine as a great asset to square dancing in the area and a wonderful supporter of the other local callers. Pelican Promenaders shared Christmas parties with Carpenter & Co, and B-Bar-H for many years.

Lorraine's cause of death was "Chronic Obstructive Lung Disease". The most likely cause was passive smoking over the years of running her hairdressing salon. Lorraine was NEVER a smoker herself. This diagnosis explains Lorraine's inability to continue calling and other activities she really loved over recent years.

It is amazing what can be learned from talking with other square dancers, even those who frequent the “Zoom” events.

For several years I have tried to be helpful to new dancers. Dancing in the left-hand position, I have guided (even gently pushed) ladies around the square, not realising I have not been totally helpful. A lady recently told me, that, besides being guided (or pushed), she really needed to understand what was expected of her, so she would know what to do the next time. It is so easy to neglect to explain, especially in the middle of a dance sequence. Mentioning this to some dancers from Canada on Zoom, the topic of “Angels” came up. The caller said being an Angel was not easy and needs a lot of patience – then went on to explain. Example given was - when doing a “Right and Left Thru”, the Angel should hold back to allow the new dancer time to digest and think about the call, then wait for them to, hopefully, make the first move, before proceeding. If the new dancer only learns by following someone else, they may not grasp the full understanding of a move.

Recently, I have been learning A1 and A2 on Zoom. I thought it was a good idea to plug my Laptop into the television so I could see the group more clearly. Unfortunately, my learning has not been great, as I have been watching and following, but not really listening to, the caller as he moves around his “square”. Consequently, the moves and their names have not sunk into my brain as well as they should have. I’ll need to learn (maybe from “Taminations”) the definitions in the hopes that one day I may succeed in dancing the “A” levels properly.

Everyone has their own way of understanding and should be allowed to learn the way they know is best for them. If you haven’t installed the “Taminations” learning program on your computer or phone, it can be found, for free downloading, on the internet.

Looking forward to dancing in Woolgoolga (maybe Newcastle) and Wentworth Falls in September. Take care and stay safe.

Post National Convention Survey Results

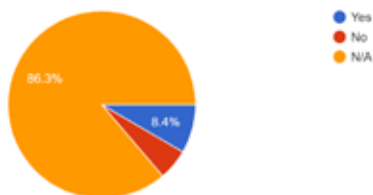
There were 142 responses received which is nearly 50% of those who attended. In summary:

Meet & Greet Session for those attending their first National Convention

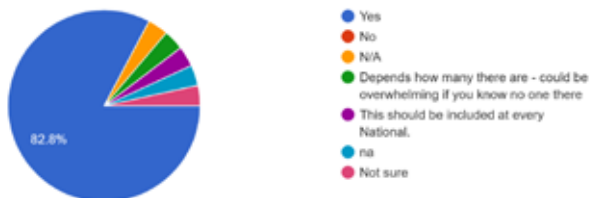
If the 62nd ANSDC in Goulburn was your first convention, did you attend the 1st timers Meet and Greet session?

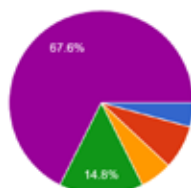

How many years have you been square dancing?

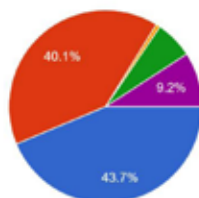

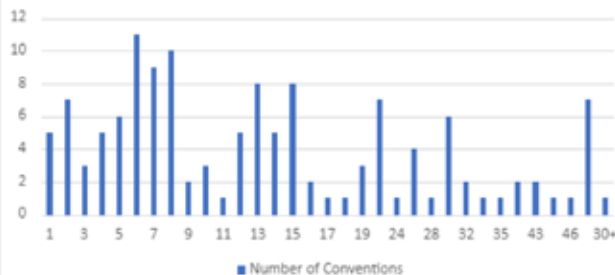

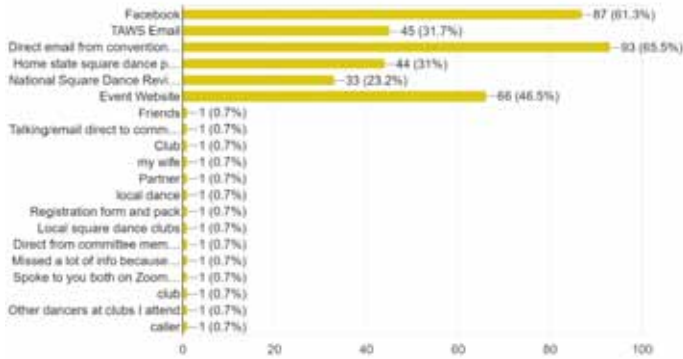
Number of Conventions people have attended

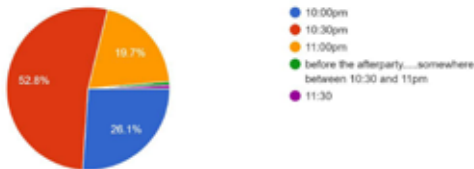
Prior to the convention, how did you obtain information about the convention - select all that are relevant

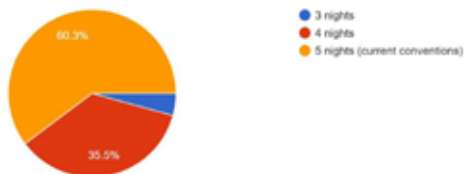
What is your preferred 'finish time' of night sessions?

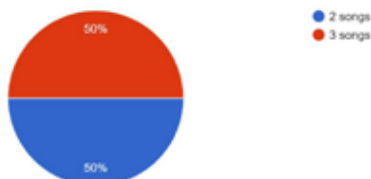
How long do you think a convention should go for?

EMERGENCY CALL FOR MEDICAL AID



- 1 When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.
- 2 Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This will allow the injured person and attendant air and room.
- 3 Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.
- 4 On seeing this signal, the caller or hall monitor will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.
