NSW President's Report

By the time you read this our 42nd NSW State Square & Round Dance Convention will be only days away. As it is a state convention session tickets will be available for the whole day and for individual sessions if you can't make the whole weekend. Meals will be available on-site each night. Please be assured that Covid protocols and procedures will be in place for dancers safety and well being. Registration packs can be collected on Friday between 3pm and 5pm from the venue or after 7pm. Look forward to seeing you all!

Government restrictions on Covid protocols are slowly being relaxed however, some dancers are still reluctant to return to dancing. This is understandable as many of our dancers are in, what the government refer to as, 'the vulnerable age group'. For this reason I strongly encourage group leaders to promote for new dancers. SARDA have produced tri-fold flyers which are free to groups. There is space for individual contact details to be added so you can personalise them. Radio ads have been produced by the National Society for use on community/commercial radio. Some stations may charge for air play and some will play them as a community service announcement. Let us know how we can help you further?

Whilst most clubs have returned to dancing it is still important to check with leaders in regard to Covid protocols, as venue hirers have different requirements that leaders must follow. Callers, cuers and leaders there is still time to claim your \$200 stimulus grant for 2022 if you haven't already done so.

Still looking for interested dancers who are ready to help organise the next state convention in NSW. SARDA will support you through the process. I'm sure there are many dancers who already run weekend festivals who would be excellent on the next convention committee.

NSW President Graeme Jarman 1999-2002



Pam and I were founding members of the Campbelltown Ghostriders Square Dance Club in 1986 with Paul Johnston as our caller. We later danced with Mexicali Squares with Tony Alessi until we made the sea-change to Harrington in 2002.

I was elected president of the NSW Square Dance Society at the 1999 AGM and remained in the position until the 2002 AGM when I did not stand for the position as Pam and I were planning our move to the Mid North Coast.

What do I recall of those three years.

- A state-wide square dance promotion to encourage dancers of all ages was held involving caller Laural Eddy-Mosley from the USA. She called at many dances and held training sessions with local callers. I was interviewed by square dancer David Evans on Blue Mountains community radio which hopefully exposed square dancing to people in the region.

- Tamworth musician Pixie Jenkins hosted the Coca-Cola dance festival in Tamworth which featured many styles of dancing including square dancing at both inside and outside venues. Tedda Brooks travelled to Tamworth to lead the square dance sessions. Square dancing gained a number of new dancers from this weekend.

- The Society began regular first Saturday of the month dances in Sydney's west. The dances featured a different invited caller each month.

- Two new caller competitions were hosted by the Society and Callers Association to give prospective callers the chance to perform. The afternoons were enjoyed by dancers and new callers despite some controversy over who should have won on the day.

- The Society and Callers Association also conducted two caller concerts where square dance callers performed songs of their choice. I remember Gary Carpenter dressed in army fatigues sitting on the edge stage singing "I Was Only Nineteen" and Ted Thomas in his bathrobe singing "Moondance".

- There was controversy at the Queanbeyan State Convention when a convention committee member attempted to exclude a dancer because he was wearing shorts and long socks. Fortunately common sense prevailed and the dancer remained on the floor. This incident again raised the issue of appropriate square dance attire which continues today.

Graeme Jarman – Neglected to apologise for his wife Pam's non attendance for the last dancers meeting. That apology tendered here today.

Don Craine: Matters arising from those minutes will be addressed in general business

Reports:

1. SARDA President David Todd
2. Interim Report for the 40th SARDA NSW State Convention 2019 read by Leanne Nicholson co convenor

David Todd – Congratulations and thanks on behalf of the association to the committee as we would have otherwise had to do both the National Convention and the State Convention. Thank you for all you have done in such a short space of time, and you have done a fabulous job.

3. Northern NSW Report. Don Craine: We do not have a written report from Northern

NSW and as most would know we lost Wilma Flannery the stalwart of that association. Is there anyone here who can give us an update.

David Todd – the next AGM to be in Woolgoolga. Consensus that they do wish to continue. The Armidale Dance will be renamed the Wilma Flannery Memorial Dance, and we will maintain that name for that event forever. All credit to Wilma for the efforts she put into square dancing over many years. Frances McAllister who is also the ACF state coordinator has taken on many of the tasks for Northern NSW and they will be continuing. Don Craine – I take it SARDA will take on the Wilma Flannery Memorial Dance in conjunction with the local club if needed.

4. 39th SARDA NSW State Convention 2018

Sandra Potter Convenor- Thanked her committee and praised them for being very professional. Members of the committee had been involved in various tasks on committees previously which meant it was not as hard as it might have been otherwise. She noted that they had to pay respects to the school. In the end we gave the school a donation because they did not want to charge us anything. This resulted in there being some revenue left over. Surplus monies went to SARDA for use for future conventions. Thanks to Jason and Leanne for convening the convention this year – as stated last year you can't NOT have a 40th State Convention. Sandra encouraged others to take on an event as there is a lot to learn about what goes behind these square dancing and the organisation of these events, and it is really worthwhile. While it is a few years work it is not constant work, but spread out over the time. David and SARDA are excellent backups for you. We really need some young people to step up and do something about keeping square dancing alive. Finally I would like to thank all the dancers because without them there wouldn't be a convention.

Don Craine – Pam Jarman did a wonderful job of statistically breaking down where registrations came from – providing a good template for future conventions giving you a good idea where to aim your promotions.

A tragic suicide occurred at the school in the weeks before the convention, and the school was in turmoil with psychologists running around, so we were only too happy to make a donation, thankfully supported by SARDA, a youth suicide prevention programme. We thank everybody who supported that endeavour.

5. Progress report 61st National Convention 2020 Rosalind Todd

Don Craine – I was a bit concerned about the “racy clothes”

Rosalind Todd – racy as in what was considered out there in the 1920's

6. Expressions of Interest for 2021 State Convention

Don Craine – Please consider getting involved – it is very satisfying. The convention can be held anywhere – city or country, just look at the list of where there have been held before. Keep in mind that the National will be held in Darwin that year in June, so it would be best to avoid that period

7. TAWS Graeme Jarman – reminded attendees that TAWS would be hosting the sausage sizzle between 0930hrs and 1100hrs at the Berry showground.



Dancer Meeting Minutes Continued

Don Craine - TAWS has an excellent app which can be downloaded for android devices. Lynn Yager – TAWS have provided an excellent publicity machine. Thanks for all the hard work and I encourage you all to join. It is not only for caravanners but anyone travelling. An excellent resource for finding out where you can find square dance events.

MOVED all reports be received and accepted- Moved Jason Nicholson. Seconded Robyn Craine. All in favour.

General Business:

1. No matters arising from the minutes from the 39th convention at Tuncurry -
2. Roslyn Burrett – Are there plans for changing State Convention badges to include SARDA. It has been some years now. And we still have badges that do not have round dance included. Rosalind Todd; This will be discussed at the next executive meeting.
3. Jane Evans – This is in relation to square dance attire for men. While this convention has been cold, much of the dancing we do is just too hot for the men in long sleeves. Is there support for changing the dress code to short sleeves for men – optional.

Editor's Note: Discussion on the pros and cons took place

David Todd – We will take this question to the next executive meeting. Initiate a survey to gauge popular opinion - reiterated that this would only apply to NSW.

4. Gary Carpenter – NSW state conventions have one state convention patron. There are four people who have attended 35+ conventions and all of them have been involved in running conventions. I'm wondering if it was time that there were a few more convention patrons of NSW State Conventions. I don't know what the guidelines are. But this is about recognition for those who have contributed to state conventions.

Jason Nicholson – moved that SARDA should look at how Patrons are nominated, including but not limited to the four mentioned. Seconded – Bob Mitchell

Ralph Jenner – I am going to suggest an amendment to that motion – that we nominate the four mentioned today. I think they have done an amazing job. Seconded – Helen Jenner

Jason Nicholson. - I don't think we should name those four today as we may find there is a fifth or sixth person. There may be people who have been on multiple committees but not attended as many conventions. I don't think it is up to this meeting to make those determinations. It should be up to SARDA. I am happy to support the amendment of nominating those four as long as it includes “not limited to” those 4.

Bob Mitchell – as seconder for Jason's motion – I am happy with the amendment as outlined by Jason. Carol Simondson – Totally agree that we should recognise those people who have given long terms of commitments to your conventions.

Lynn Yager – Privileged to have been the presenter to Ron Burrett of recognition as a

life patron of square dance conventions. Unfortunately Ron felt that it meant that he had to contribute more and we failed to convince him that he had done enough. So I would like to see a clear idea of what exactly does it mean to be a Life Patron.



Don Craine – We have a process for appointing Life Patrons. SARDA to review Life patron guidelines. Carol Simondson – there needs to be a point of difference between service to the activity vs attendance. Perhaps a certificate of appreciation versus life patronage. The criteria need to be established.

John Carpenter – I don't feel that I have done enough to merit a Life Patronage. I haven't done anything like what Roz has done. I would like Roz to be recognised today.

Don Craine – The final decision should be left to SARDA.

5. Carole Carpenter – Thank you to the convention committee for a wonderful convention. They have done a wonderful job in a short time. The decorations were fabulous. Thanks Roz again. We come along and enjoy ourselves and it is nice to recognise the hard work of the committee and congratulate them on a job well done.

Don Craine. - carried by acclamation

EMERGENCY CALL FOR MEDICAL AID



- 1 When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.
- 2 Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This will allow the injured person and attendant air and room.
- 3 Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.
- 4 On seeing this signal, the caller or hall monitor will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.
