Tribute to Joe Lewis



How many of you have an old 78 of Square Dances called by Joe Lewis. It seems that we have collected a few in the NSW Archives. The following article was taken from the February 1984 and March 1993 issue of the South Pacific Square Dance Review.

Joe Lewis first visited Australia in 1950 to promote square dancing. During that visit Joe trained a team of dancers so that they could give an exhibition of square dancing to the public. This exhibition was at David Jones' restaurant, Elizabeth Street Store, Sydney. The exhibitions were such a success that Sydney Dance Studios received many requests to teach square dancing. Joe and his wife Claire were only too happy to help out.

In 1951 the Australian Women's Weekly and large city stores sponsored a second visit by Joe and Claire.

Joe came to Australia on his third visit arriving at Mascot Sydney on the overseas airliner "Discovery" on Saturday 31st October 1953. During the wait for the plane to land and Joe to emerge through customs, the lounge at the overseas terminal overflowed as square dancers continued to arrive to welcome him.

There were callers from every Sydney Square Dance club as well as many interstate visitors. Among them were Jim Vickers-Willis, Gary Cohen, Jim Burke, Ron Jones, Vince Spillane, David Rintel, and leading Australian dance promoters, Barry Brennan Jnr, from Earls Court, Melbourne, Joe Loves of Paradance and Australian National Square Dance Club fame, Sydney, and Jack Keating of Keating's Ballrooms, Sydney.

Joe's first words on emerging from customs and seeing such a large crowd were "Why, howdy folks; have you got those squares ready?"

Joe who was affectionately known as "Grand-Pappy" of Australian square dancing, showed the dancers how very simply they could miss out on one of the main essentials of square dancing. "Having a happy time, even with beginners' dances". His recipe for square dancing - "Get them dancing" - "Keep them dancing" - "Keep them happy".

The Paradance Ballroom at Lidcombe stood in readiness to say "Bon Voyage" on behalf of square dancers from coast to coast of our island continent to Joe Lewis, on Friday, 18th December, 1953.

The hall was filled to capacity and there was no stopping Joe Lewis. In between brackets



while all and sundry sat on the floor with their picnic suppers, he brought surprise after surprise out of his bag of acts, and when everyone was clamouring for more he would put on his best "deadpan" and say.... "Let's dance," throwing the whole place~ into a pandemonium of laughter and gaiety. "DON'T GO, JOE"

At the end of the evening he was besieged with square dance enthusiasts who wanted commemorative autographs.

Following is a passage taken from a letter published in the "National Square Dancer" about Joe Lewis.

"Having been with Joe Lewis for some time I can truthfully say that it has not been my pleasure to meet a finer person. His complete knowledge of square dancing will be of immeasurable value to us, and I am sure that if we follow the advice he is so gladly giving, then square dancing will be truly a part of the lives of nearly every family in Australia.

"With his kindly smile and unfailing good humour, coupled with a firmness that comes from a completely organised mind, Joe has brought to us the real square dancing that has taken him 15 years to perfect."

John Brennan, President, National Square Dance Club of Australia.

Joe's fourth and last visit to Australia was in April 1984 when the Committee of the 25th Australian National "Silver Jubilee" Square Dance Convention held in Canberra invited him along with his wife Claire to be the guest of honour at that convention.

“LA RONDE” (The Round Dancer)

This month, I would like to delve back a little and pass on to you a glimpse of a girl whose name we all know: **“TAMARA”**

Our dance history is dotted with interesting people, who have loved the dance and added their own touch of colour in passing. This is the story of Tamara, as related by that grand master, Dr. Lloyd "Pappy" Shaw.

"Each summer my dancers are a part of the famous Central City Play House Festival. We hold forth in the old Williams' livery stable which has been roughly fitted up for us, and which is opposite the famous old miners' Opera House, where metropolitan opera stars now present delightful performances for two or three weeks each summer. After one of our performances many years ago one of my dancers came to me and said there was a girl who wanted to talk to me. When she arrived she was dressed in hiking clothes, very simply, and she told me how much she liked our dancing.

"You wouldn't know me, but I am working over ,at the Teller House.' That was the famous old mining camp hotel, used by the opera association as the centre of their social life. 'I do a little singing there,' she added, 'and I love your dances very much. Do you mind if I come over often?'

Suddenly I realised who she was. This humble, simple girl was the much advertised Tamara, special star of the Teller House Night Club. She was a great Broadway star, where she introduced and made popular songs such as 'Smoke Gets In Your Eyes'.

Tamara, with other notables, was killed in an air crash the year America entered the war.

"Her simplicity was completely disarming. She told me she had been a refugee from White Russia and she was afraid the old native dances she had loved there were not being kept alive. 'Most folk dancers I have seen in this country are rather stiff and unnatural. But it seems to me your young dancers have the real spirit. Would you please let me come to your rehearsals and let me teach you some of our dances, so that you will be able to keep them alive?'

"And what delightful hours we had with her! Perhaps the favourite of the dances she left with us was a waltz which we always called the Tamara Waltz. Although it is not very' simple, many people have learned it from us and we have enjoyed seeing it spread from place to place."

Dancers everywhere have got themselves in knots and laughed at the tangle as they mastered the Tamara turn. May your dancing be the richer for this story of a young girl who, too, loved to dance.

EMERGENCY CALL FOR MEDICAL AID



- 1 When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.
- 2 Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This will allow the injured person and attendant air and room.
- 3 Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.
- 4 On seeing this signal, the caller or hall monitor will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.
